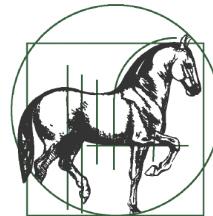

FAQs for 2026 Summer Solstice I & II

Q: What are the Show Office hours?

A: Friday 1:00 pm to 6:30 pm. Pony Measurements will begin at 5:00 pm on Friday. Exact times will be communicated to those who have requested measurements from the show management prior to the show. Sound checks on Friday from 5:30 pm to 6:30 pm. On Saturday and Sunday, the Show Office opens one hour before the first ride of the day and closes 30 minutes after the last ride of the day.

Q: Where is the Show Office?

A: Show office location: at the north end of the main barn in separate show office building. Follow signage. Come to the Show Office for checking in, changes, fees, or with any questions you have. The Show Office has an area for the scoring team who need quiet for data entry; please don't disturb them.

Q: I have a few hours. Can I volunteer at this show?

A: Yes! And thank you! Riders please sign up for a minimum two-hour shift sometime during the weekend. Show management will work with you to make this easy. The volunteer coordinator is located outside the show office.

Q: Can I be a scribe at this show?

A: We try to secure all needed scribes prior to the start of the show, but every now and again we need someone to fill in. If you have scribing experience and are interested in seeing if there are slots available, come to the show office.

Q: Where are the ride times by rider?

A: Day Sheets (Ride Time Sheets) list the rider/horse in each class and the exact time that pair will be in the show ring. Ride times will be posted and available through Fox Village (www.foxvillage.com) and Day Sheets are posted by the Show Office. **Remember to double check your ride times** as they may have changed from the preliminary ride times sent out earlier in the week.

Q: Where are the results posted?

A: Results will be available online through Fox Village at www.foxvillage.com. Results by class, with rankings, are printed on physical sheets and posted outside the show office. Please allow time after the last ride of the class for results. For large classes or classes with out-of-order rides interim scores may be posted and labeled as "interim."

Q: Are results also posted online?

A: Yes. Scores will be posted to Fox Village (www.foxvillage.com) in real time as soon as the test is scored.

Q: When and where can I pick up my tests/ribbons?

A: Once your class closes and the final results are posted, you may pick up your test and ribbons outside the show office. Please allow time for large classes to close and the scoring office to validate scores.

Q: I want to leave, but results aren't posted yet. Will you just mail me my test and ribbon?

A: If you need to leave before your class results are posted, you may have a representative you designate pickup your test and ribbon, or you can come to the office and request your test is mailed to you. Sorry, no ribbons will be mailed.

Q: What if I need a vet or farrier?

A: Both a practicing veterinarian and farrier are on call for the show.

Each competitor is responsible for supplying Management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition. Ribbons awarded through 8th Place and gift certificates awarded to top four riders.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
- or*
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

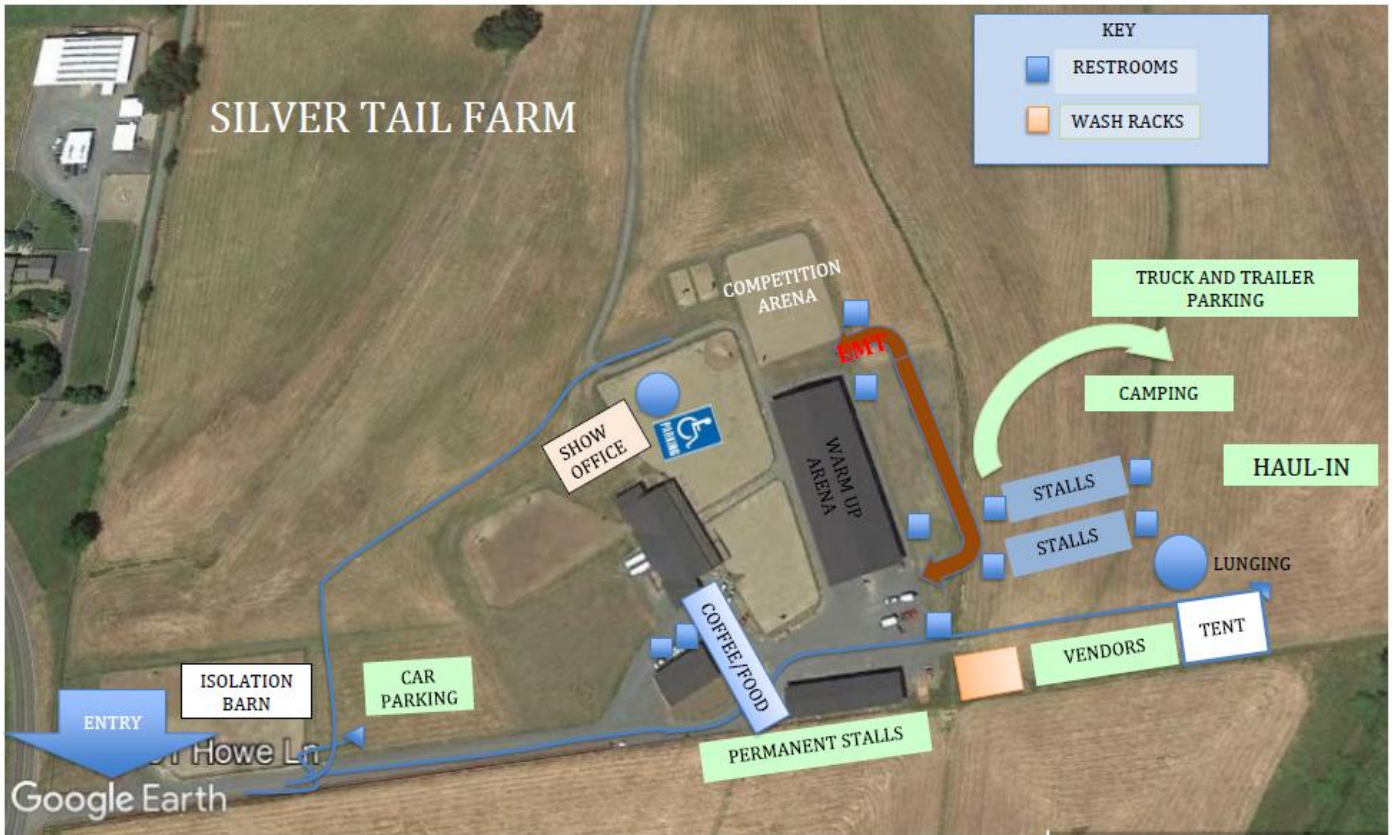

2026 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2026 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.
- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual Recorded Farm/Business (with Senior Active Competing Farm Owner in good standing)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider.

ODS LICENSED CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFICATION

ODS has offered an annual Championship Show since 1981. This show is traditionally the largest annual fundraiser for our organization and is a showcase of the best ODS horses and riders. You may qualify! Please join us for this wonderful event.

QUALIFYING RULES

General:

- Rider must be a **CURRENT ODS MEMBER** in good standing **AT TIME SCORES ARE EARNED**
- Each horse entered must be ridden by the same rider throughout the competition
- Additionally, at no time during the Championship competition may an entered horse be ridden by anyone other than the rider entered on that horse (with the exception of a groom walking on a loose rein)
- Attach photocopies of the front cover of the qualifying tests to the entry form

Qualifying:

- **The qualifying season is September 1st of the previous year to August 25th of the current year**
- Qualifying scores must be earned by a **horse/rider combination**, they cannot be earned separately
- Only scores received at USEF/USDF Licensed shows may be used
- Only scores received using current USDF / USEF / FEI approved dressage tests count
- Championship scores will be calculated by averaging the percentages earned in the two tests ridden
- Scores from the following dressage tests do not count for the ODS Championship Show:
 - Dressage equitation
 - Dressage suitability
 - Rider tests
 - USDF Introductory Level
 - Opportunity classes
 - Lead line classes
 - Scores earned at ODS approved league shows and practice shows

Championship Classes:

- Classes will be run under USEF/USDF Championship Rules
- Championship classes **must be ridden from memory**
- Whips are **not** allowed
- We will not be closing competition arena gates during tests, nor raking centerlines between riders.

Tests:

- Tests selected for championship classes are at the discretion of show management
- Training–Fourth Levels will ride the two highest tests of the level
- FEI Championship classes will be judged by two judges
- Horse/rider combinations may enter two levels, but may only ride in one division (Open, Adult Amateur, or Junior/Young Rider)
- Horse/rider combinations winning Championship Show classes may not compete at that level in future championship classes (except FEI)

Minimum Qualifying Scores:

- Entries must have earned two qualifying scores; per level, per division, and from two different judges at two separate competitions
- Qualifying scores may be earned at any test from the level
- The minimum percentages are as follows:

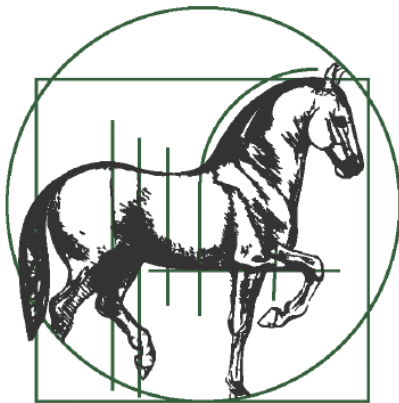
