Opportunity Classes: Riders/Horses competing **only** in “opportunity” classes are exempt from membership requirements and do not have to pay NM, HID or USEF drug fees. In addition, owners, trainers & coaches are exempt from membership requirements for these classes. All USEF Dressage Division rules apply (including dress & saddlery requirements) in addition to all applicable General Rules & Medications. “Opportunity” riders & horses may cross enter non-opportunity classes, but if you do so all USEF/USDF membership requirements & fees will apply. Scores earned in “opportunity” classes may not be used toward USEF/USDF awards programs or Twin Rivers High Point awards.

REFUNDS: - *cancellation and any other non-refundable fees will be deducted from all refunds.*

Before closing date: all money refunded, less the non-refundable fees.

After closing date: all fees refunded, less the non-refundable fees, only with a letter from vet or doctor **and** only if we are able to fill your ride times from a waiting list, Twin Rivers Chapter reserves the right to cancel, without refunds to the riders, all or part of the competition including individual classes, due to a storm, acts of God, accident or other emergency.

RIDE TIMES and CLASSES

Ride Times

Ride times will be e-mailed to riders if entry contains legible e-mail address **and/or** ride times will be posted at Fox Village and on show grounds prior to the show.

It is the competitor's responsibility to obtain ride times from show secretary

Classes

Classes may be combined for efficient scheduling and may not be scheduled in the order presented in this list. Management reserves the right to change classes to another day if proper scheduling warrants and/or to limit the size (number of rides) in any class, combine or split Jr/YR, AA, or Open riders

Awards

Awards to first, ribbons through sixth place.

High Point per division (AA/Open/Jr/YR) prize per Level. (*Introductory level, Musical Freestyles, Equitation and Materiale not to count for High Point Awards*).

Bio-Security Information

This competition will be run in accordance with USEF's COVID-19 Action Plan updated 9 December 2022, which refers to the local area's restrictions. Note: Lane County, Oregon no longer has any restrictions, other than masking for healthcare services.

1) All persons entering competition grounds should self-monitor their temperature once daily prior to entering the competition grounds. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4° F (38° C) or higher may not enter the facility.

2) The following individuals are not allowed to enter the competition grounds:

- a) Anyone who exhibits COVID-19 symptoms, including a temperature of 100.4° F (38° C) or higher,
- b) Anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within last 5 days,
- c) Anyone who has tested positive outside of the past 5 days, but is still symptomatic.

This competition will be run in accordance with USEF's & Oregon Department of Agriculture and California Department of Food and Agriculture's (CDFA's) biosecurity recommendations (great biosecurity protocol reference). USEF has not updated its recommendations since the 2022 outbreaks of Equine Herpes Virus (EHV-1) and Equine Herpesvirus Myeloencephalopathy (EVM).

ODA reminds horse owners traveling with horses to participate in an equine event, that there is always disease risk when horses of unknown health status are commingled for a show or competition. Compliance with basic biosecurity practices is an important factor in reducing risk of exposure to all contagious equine diseases.

This event is implementing biosecurity measures to ensure infectious disease agents are not introduced or spread at this event. All horses and livestock that enter the grounds may be subject to examination by event officials/designated representatives and/or State Animal Health official to determine if the animal is or has been infected/exposed, or are likely to be infected with, an infectious or contagious disease. If after such examination, an official believes the health condition of an animal will place other animals at risk, the officials may quarantine the animal(s) and others that may have been infected/exposed, or, if necessary, require movement of the animal(s) from the show grounds.

All participants must agree to fully cooperate with examining officials and abide by their decisions/instructions. Failure to comply with officials shall be grounds for immediate expulsion of the participant from the grounds and potential disciplinary action(s) by the sponsoring organization and local/state or federal officials. In the event of an emergency or infectious disease incident at the event, all participants and horses will remain at the venue until event management provides clearance for departure from the event premises. In the case of infectious disease event, event officials will evaluate individual horse disease exposure risk and provide owner/agents with follow up disease monitoring instructions. In the event movement restrictions are put in place, each owner/agent is responsible for the care and maintenance of their horse(s) on the premises.

1) **Cleaning and Disinfection Protocol:** Silver Tail Farm, LLC will disinfect all surfaces in every stall prior to the start of this event. Please note: cleaning and disinfection reduces the risk but may not eliminate risk of exposure to pathogens.

2) **Healthy Horse Policy:** Per USEF rules, all competitors must have in their possession proof of horse vaccination and are required to present it to the Technical Delegate or Management upon request.

3) **No Fever Policy:** Exhibitors shall check each horse's temperature at least once per day while on the show grounds. Exhibitors, Owners, Trainers and anyone attending this event shall immediately report any suspicion of illness in horses, including a temperature over 102°F to the Show Secretary or Manager. The Secretary or Manager will then report as soon as possible to the show committee or Manager as appropriate for further action, including but not limited to calling the on-call veterinarian for consultation at the horse owner's expense or sending the horse home.

4) Exhibitors shall provide alcohol wipes or alcohol hand sanitizer products at their stall(s) or trailer(s) for use by people handling multiple horses to maximize biosecurity between horses.

In addition, the following biosecurity measures are recommended:

- Avoid sharing of equipment, to include tack, water buckets, brushes, etc.
- Avoid use of communal water troughs
- Avoid submerging end of water hose in water bucket
- Do not allow horses to drink directly from a water hose
- Avoid tying horses to fences or gates near the competition area
- Cover all feed and hay to prevent access by vermin, birds or other animals
- Thoroughly clean and disinfect all equipment before use at the home premises
- Isolate and monitor all animals upon return to the home premises.

Twin Rivers Show Series High Point Awards.

Riders at Twin Rivers Solstice I & II and Twin Rivers Classic I & II will be eligible for the following High Point prizes.

Open - \$200 Cash and ribbon

Adult Amateur– \$200 Cash and ribbon

Junior /Young Rider – \$200 Cash and ribbon

Open rider must compete in a combination of 4 classes: 3 Third Level – FEI Level plus 1 Third Level - FEI Level

Adult Amateur rider must compete in a combination of 3 classes: 2 First Level – FEI Level

Junior/Young rider must compete in a total of 4 Training Level -FEI classes.

Rides do not need to be on same horse.

ABOUT THE FACILITY:

Arenas and Footing:

Competition arenas are outdoors with Premier Equestrian ProTex and All Purpose Footing mixed with beach sand from Florence and Silica Sand from Lane Mountain in Washington. Warm up will be indoors Premier Equestrian Athletics and sand footing. All tests will be ridden in a 20m x 60m court.

Stabling:

All stabling Friday noon until after show on Sunday. Additional days by request.

10 permanent 12x12 matted box stalls in the upper event barn with full door.

40 portable 12x12 matted box stalls with full door and tent cover.

Stabling is allocated in the order in which requests are received.

All stabling is for Friday through Sunday.

First day's bedding (1 bale) is provided. Additional bedding for sale available \$10/bale from the show office.

Trailer/Exhibitor Parking:

Please abide by the signs and the personnel that will be helping exhibitor's park. Please park in the same direction/location as other trailers. Please park as close to the trailer next to you as reasonably safe. Exhibitors will be working from their trailers, so please leave reasonable space. Please leave driveway aisle clear through parking area to facilitate vehicle movements.

Camping:

Dry camping is available. Vehicle and/or trailer must be equipped with a fire extinguisher. **No open flame** BBQs, fire pits or smoking allowed on premises.

Dogs:

There are no dogs allowed on the show grounds except with permission of management. Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be held on a leash or otherwise restrained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dogowners failing to comply with this rule will be issued a Yellow warning card may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7. GR 1301

Sharps containers:

Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. GR1210.4

Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition. Ribbons awarded through 8th Place and gift certificates awarded to top four riders.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- a) Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.

or

- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

2026 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2026 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.
- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual Recorded Farm/Business (with Senior Active Competing Farm Owner in good standing)). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$100), 5-years (\$400), or life (\$2,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$80). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$280) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$55 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$45). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$95. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$140) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USDF and USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

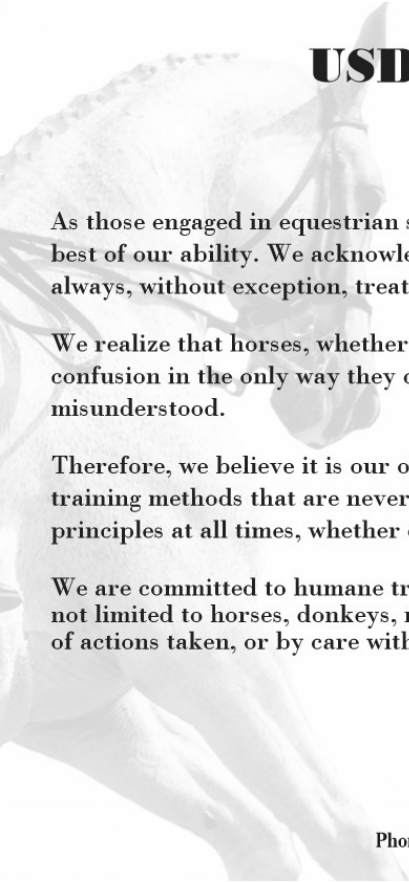
MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.



USDF Horse Welfare Statement

As those engaged in equestrian sport, we are committed to ensuring our horses receive the best possible care to the best of our ability. We acknowledge that we are the caretakers of our horses and as such we are committed to always, without exception, treating our horses with dignity, fairness, kindness, and understanding.

We realize that horses, whether in a herd or as an individual, will communicate contentment, fear, pain and confusion in the only way they can, which often takes the form of physical reactions that can be misinterpreted and misunderstood.

Therefore, we believe it is our obligation to seek to understand our horses with the goal of providing care and training methods that are never the manifestation of anger, frustration or cruelty. We are committed to these principles at all times, whether on or off the show grounds.

GR801 – DR120.1.1 – Helmet Rule

Protective Headgear. Protective headgear in compliance with the accepted testing standards published on the Federation's website. Protective headgear must carry the applicable quality testing tag and/or label. See GR801. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para Dressage tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear may be the same as or a coordinating color with the coat, and may include contrast coloring, accent, and crystal decoration

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and _____ ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF INHERENT RISKS: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with equine activities, including but not limited to horseback riding and equestrian sport, are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:

CAUTION: HORSEBACK RIDING AND EQUINE ACTIVITIES CAN BE DANGEROUS. RIDE AT YOUR OWN RISK.

Under the laws of most States, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for any injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. I understand that horse tack or other horse equipment can break, loosen, or otherwise fail, causing serious injury to me, including permanent injury and/or death, or damage to my property, including but not limited to my horse. I understand that any rider or handler of a horse may lose control of such horse at any time and for any reason, and that doing so may cause serious injury to me and my minor child, including permanent injury and/or death, or damage to my property, including my horse. I further understand that I am solely responsible for using proper safety equipment at all times while near, grooming, handling, lunging, and riding horses, including but not limited to wearing an ASTM-certified riding helmet and riding boots. I understand that the risks set forth in this paragraph and other similar risks are inherent to participation in any "equine activity" as defined by ORS § 30.687(2).

I understand there are potential hazards at an equine facility, including but not limited to uneven, slippery or rocky footing, open water, rodent holes, molehills, irrigation equipment, farming equipment, drainage and irrigation ditches, hoses, livestock, electric fencing, and loud noises. I further understand and acknowledge that there may be animals, including but not limited to dogs, other horses, cows, insects, reptiles, deer, cougars, coyotes, and bears, present at or in close proximity to an equine facility that present a risk of serious harm, injury, illness, damage, disease, or death to me, my child, and my property, including my horse.

The equine facility at which Silver Tail Farm, LLC ("Silver Tail") operates its business, including but not limited to the barns, arenas, outbuildings, paddocks, pastures, driveway(s), etc. is referred to herein as "Stable." I understand that by directly engaging in any such equine activity, I am a "participant" in an equine activity as defined by ORS § 30.687(5).
